Lovers' Lane Bandit Gets 25-28 Years

HIGH POINT — An 18-year-old Negro who had been dubbed the "Hooded Bandit of Lover's Lane" was sentenced in Guilford Superior Court today to 25 to 28 years for kidnaping, assault with intent to commit rape, robbery, breaking and entering, and larceny.

CRUMP ARRESTED

Crump was arrested in July after two occasions on which automobiles parked on a lonely road near Sedgfield were entered and their occupants were robbed. Crump was charged with raping Pearl Barber of Raleigh, who was in one of the cars. The court accepted a plea of guilty to the lesser charge of assault with intent to commit rape.

THE CHARGES

Three charges of kidnaping, 25 to 28 years; a charge of assault with intent to rape, 5 to 10 years; consolidated robbery charges, 10 to 15 years; consolidated breaking and entering charges, 5 to 10 years larceny, 2 years.

One-Party System Abolished

VIENNA (AP) — The Budapest Radio late today broadcast an announcement by Premier Nagy that Soviet troops have started pulling out of Budapest.

VIENNA (AP) — Hungary's Red Government virtually conceded complete victory to the revolutionary forces today and called on the nation to prepare for free elections. Premier Imre Nagy announced in a broadcast similar to that established just after the end of World War II in 1945.

FIGHTING EASES OFF

Fighting slackened off at the Maria Teresia Barracks, a rebel stronghold in a week of civil war. Insurgents who had held out against Soviet tanks marched out defiantly this morning and announced they would not pull down their arms until the Russians have left Budapest.

TITLE OUT

12-Hour Ultimatum Is Issued

Bandits Knock Over Three More Safes During Night

Safe crackers got \$2,000 in cash and \$3,000 in checks at the Dixie News Co., 211 N. Graham St., sometime last night.

PUNCHED OUT

The other safe had the dial punched out. Thieves got \$800 in cash and \$200 in checks from two metal boxes in the safe. They also got \$1,200 in cash and \$2,000 in checks from seven small bags which drivers carry on their collection routes.

ENTER WINDOW

In order to enter the Dixie News Co. the thieves first tried open a window in the Singleton & Hartsell Body Works, located next door. Then they forced a large double door to get into the news company.

Detectives said they did not believe the thieves would risk trying to cash any of the checks. At least some of them were made out to the Dixie News Co.

Charlotte Police Chief Frank N. Littlejohn said that recent local safe jobs are part of a series of safecrackings across the country. He said safe crackers always are active in the fall months because of the heavy amounts of money being spent and left in safes.

Chief Littlejohn said many of these safe jobs could be prevented if people would deposit large amounts of money left in unguarded safes are an invitation to thieves.

The robbery was discovered by an office employee, Lucille West, when she came to work at 7:45 a.m. Mr. Braswell said the theft must have occurred after 11:40 p.m. yesterday.
