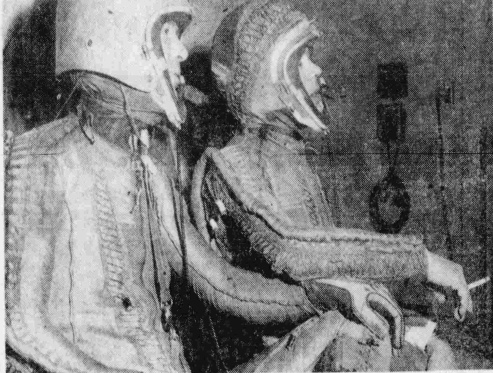

Balloon Men Ready For Record Attempt.

Two Navy Balloon Men Soar To Altitude Of 76,000 Feet

RAPID CITY, S. D. (AP)—Two Navy men calmly sipped cups of coffee today as they soared to a record height of 76,000 feet in a gondola attached to a big gas-filled balloon.

The balloon took off from a "stratobowl" in the Black Hills near here at 7:19 a.m. (CST).

The balloon and gondola shot into the sky at almost 600 feet a minute when mooring ropes were cut. As it rose above the bow, the big plastic bag reflected a red glow from the morning sky.
