



Hungarian Police Break Up Demonstration In Budapest

Follow Russian Orders

BUDAPEST (AP) — Hungarian police, acting on Russian orders, broke up a mass demonstration in front of the U. S. Embassy today.

The police used their rifle butts in an assault on a crowd of about 400 — men, women and children — who had gathered before the embassy shouting:

"Down with the AVH (secret police) . . . No more deportations! . . . Down with the government!"

American officials estimated at least two truckloads of the demonstrators were carried off by the police. Witnesses said some were children. Several Hungarians were seen to fall to the ground.

Hundreds of Hungarian women had congregated in the streets for the second consecutive day in mourning for insurgents killed in the anti-Communist rebellion.

Two bursts of machine gun fire were heard, but the scene of the shooting could not be located.

NEW STRIKE!

Persistent rumors floated around Budapest that a new general strike would be called tomorrow.

Some women massed in front of the British legation, but were chased away by two huge Russian T-34 tanks. Tanks and armored cars forestalled efforts of a group of women to parade in front of the Petofi monument.

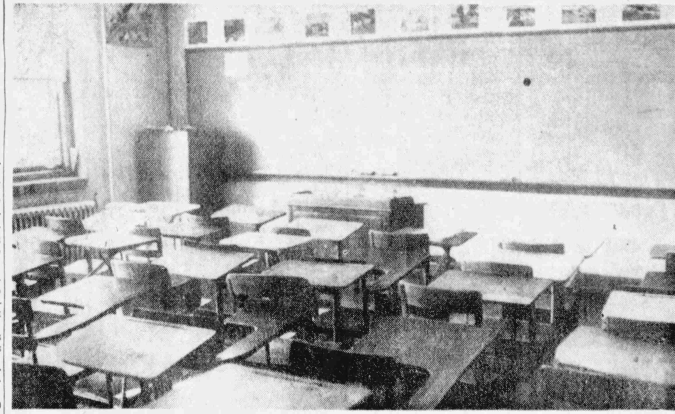
The crowd which converged on the U. S. Embassy sought to send a delegation inside, but Hungarian policemen required the Americans to lock the doors.

The Russians moved more tanks and armored cars into the city as a precaution, but ordered Hungarian soldiers and police to handle the job of dispersing the women.

Most of the demonstration was orderly. It involved about 2,500 women, made up of groups of about 200 each. Yesterday about 15,000 demonstrated and a woman was wounded by gunfire after an altercation with a Soviet officer.

The women again marched with bouquets, flags and mourning

Charges Due In Clinton

CLINTON, Tenn. (AP) — A federal judge at Knoxville will be expected today to cite "several persons" in connection with Clinton's newest outbreak of racial violence.

U. S. Dist. Judge Robert L. Taylor declined comment on what he has decided to do regarding persons accused of taking part in violence which caused newly integrated Clinton High School to close indefinitely yesterday.

But court officials at nearby Knoxville said they expected "several persons" — they said they did not know how many — to be cited for contempt of court in connection with yesterday's disorders.

In any case, no arrests are expected until late afternoon.

A Baptist minister, a white man, was beaten after he escorted six Negro students to the school past a jeering crowd inside the school a teacher was notified by one of two youths who appeared at her classroom door and asked, "Where's the niggers?"

In the midst of this racial turmoil Clinton residents turned out in record numbers yesterday to vote 4-1 against pro-segregation candidates in a municipal election.

Former Mayor T. L. Seebler received 1,241 votes to 343 cast for James C. Meredith, who had the backing of the White Citizens Council.

However, neither candidate had taken a stand on the segregation issue.

Two alderman candidates supported Seebler.

'God Was With Us' Nasser Says Aim Was To 'Destroy'

CAIRO, Egypt (AP) — President Nasser charged today the attack on Egypt by Britain, France and Israel represented a conspiracy aimed at the "full and complete destruction of his country."

"God was with us," he declared.

The 38-year-old president, a lieutenant colonel and a veteran of the 1948 Palestine War, gave his detailed account of the military operation in a signed article in the Cairo weekly newspaper Akhbar Sa'a.

He wrote that he was surprised when Britain launched its attack because he had considered it "most improbable that any responsible Britain would take such action."

"It was not a question of a canal passing through Egypt," Nasser said, "but it was a question of Egypt itself."

He asserted that Egypt's military strength and political influence endangered Britain's position in its struggle against nationalist rebels in Algeria.

Israel alone, he said, could not "do anything against us." Captured enemy documents, Nasser claimed, showed the aim of the Israeli forces was to reach Ismailia and contact British and French forces there.

Nasser said he felt Egypt had "won the battle" in its withdrawal from the Sinai Desert after Israeli forces struck in the area Oct. 29.

CUT OFF COSTLY

Detailing Egypt's military position on that date, Nasser said only the National Guard was responsible for the Gaza Strip and that Egypt always knew that narrow ring of land could be cut off easily.

On the Egyptian-Palestinian frontier, he continued, Egypt had six divisions and their equipment at only three points in the north. There were no other troops in the Sinai, he added, and the rest of Egypt's main forces were stationed west of the Suez Canal for quick movement in the event of an attack.

Lloyd Denies Israel Incited

LONDON (AP) — Foreign Secretary Selwyn Lloyd denied today that Britain collaborated with Israel in the invasion of Egypt but said "it is true" that he was aware of the possibility of trouble.

Lloyd, leading off a crucial debate in the House of Commons over the government's Middle East policy, declared "it is quite wrong to state that Israel was incited" by Britain to invade Egypt.

"There was no prior agreement between us about it," he said.

He maintained that "every time any incident has happened on the frontiers of Israel and the Arab states, we have been accused of being in collusion with the Israelis about it."

Clinton's New Mayor To 'Abide By The Law'

CLINTON, Tenn. (AP) — The next mayor of Clinton once offered \$1,000 of his own money to send Negro high school pupils to nearby Knoxville.

While Thomas L. Seebler was being elected yesterday the town was again shaken by racial trouble that has plagued it since a Federal Court order forced integration at the high school last fall.

Seebler, 57, received 1,241 votes to 343 cast for James C. Meredith, who had the backing of the White Citizens Council.

The mayor-elect said last night he is going to "abide by the law, and expect everyone else to."

Seebler made his \$1,000 offer soon after a Federal Court ordered 12 Negroes admitted to Clinton High School.

Previously the 12 had attended of a Negro school at Knoxville, 20 miles to the southeast. There is no Negro high school in Anderson County where Clinton is the county seat.

Last night Seebler told newsmen he prefers separate but equal school facilities but "that doesn't change the fact that the recent decision of the courts provides otherwise."

He added, "I am not a member of the school board and won't jump into their field," and declined further comment.

Seebler made his \$1,000 offer soon after a Federal Court ordered 12 Negroes admitted to Clinton High School.

Previously the 12 had attended of a Negro school at Knoxville, 20 miles to the southeast. There is no Negro high school in Anderson County where Clinton is the county seat.
