Making the main political report to the 20th Congress of the Soviet Communist party, which opened in Moscow yesterday, Mr. Khruschev, First Secretary, declared that, because of the strengthening of the "camp of peace," the Kremlin no longer considered wars or revolutions inevitable. This represents a substantial revision of Marxist theory

In a speech remarkable for its confident tone, Mr. Khruschev outlined a plan for advancing world Communism without resort to violence. He declared that to-day "imperialism" was so enfeebled that in many countries the revolutionary movement could triumph even by using Parliamentary institutions. His main points included:

Russia believed in "peaceful co-existence," but it was up to the West to improve East-West relations.

2.—Co-existence was the only alternative to "the most devastating war in history." This would be the graveyard of capitalism.

3.—Russia now had the support of more than half the world's population for its policies.
4.—She was ready, on certain conditions, to agree to a cessation of further hydrogen bomb tests.

5.—"Many serious problems" in the living standard emained. He insisted on priority for heavy industry, but poke of more housing and consumer goods.
