### CIA Reported Too Sensitive To Be Probed

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21 (AP)—Sen. Bridges (R-NH) said today President Eisenhower has told Republican legislative leaders he regards the operations of the Central Intelligence Agency as "too sensitive" to be examined by Congress.

Bridges said Sen. Knowland of California, the GOP leader, reported to the Senate Intelligence Committee in a closed session today that Eisenhower is "very much opposed" to a bill by Sen. Mansfield (D-Mont.).

Mansfield's bill, approved by the Senate Rules Committee for Senate consideration, would set up a joint Senate-House watchdog committee to check on CIA operations. A reporter asked Bridges at a news conference if Knowland told the policy committee it is the President's view that intelligence activities "are too delicate for Congress to have any knowledge of them."

"That's right," Bridges said. "He said it was too sensitive for Congress to take it up."

The Hoover Commission on Government Reorganization, of which Bridges was a member, recommended setting up a commission by presidential executive order.

Red Cross Group Seeks To Control Georgia Railroad

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21 (AP)—The Seaboard Air Line Railroad today asked the Interstate Commerce Commission for the right to share in ownership of the Central of Georgia Railway.

The lengthening boycott has brought some violence but no injuries. Dynamite bombs have exploded at the homes of two of the leading figures in the Negro protest movement—the Rev. Martin Luther King Jr. and E. D. Nixon.

More than 200 witnesses were called in the eight-day proceedings held in the Montgomery County Courthouse.

Seaboard said it is willing to share in stock control of Central either equally with the Frisco alone or equally with Frisco and Illinois Central.

The original Frisco application has been scheduled for hearing at Savannah, Ga., March 15.

### Boycotting Illegal Under Alabama Law

A state law on "boycotting and blacklisting" was the basis on which the grand jury indictments were returned.

The action of the board came on a unanimous vote, thereby blocking Gray from any further appeal to higher authorities.

Gray had been classified as 4, the classification of a "practicing minister," since 1948. Under that classification he was exempt from military service.

Conviction of that charge automatically would provide for Gray's disarmament in Alabama.

### French In Algiers Hunting Deserters

ALGERS, Algeria, Feb. 21 (AP)—Desertion of 20 to 30 Algerian soldiers from a French unit during a pitched battle with rebel nationalists drew strong reinforcing columns of French troops to the Port-Saïd area today.

Scattered desertions have been common but nothing of the size of the Port-Saïd incident ever happened before.

The flight took place Sunday night and Monday morning in western Algeria, when a rebel band of about 150 attacked French troops.

Two other rebel bands did other battles in eastern Algeria at about the same time.

Gov. Folsom Issues Plea For 'Calmness'

Gov. James E. Folsom yesterday called on white persons and Negroes in Alabama to "approach our problems in the spirit of calmness, understanding, debate and deliberation."

Although his statement was issued almost simultaneously with the special elections and special sessions, Folsom noted, "it is the best liberty the American people ever bought."

Gov. Folsom issued the statement today in Montgomery.

He noted, instead, the "world-wide attention which has been very much overplayed in regard to the recent University of Alabama situation."

That was a reference to the recent demonstrations at the University following the admittance of a Negro child, Autherine Lucy.

The governor's statement said: "According to press reports and communications recently received in the executive office, we have received worldwide attention which has been very much overplayed in regard to the recent University of Alabama situation."

"Naturally there is a fundamental difference between races and since the beginning of time. There is a difference in the fundamental laws of nature regarding the animal kingdom.

The great masses of Alabama Negroes do not fear their white brothers as much as they do some of their own anxious leaders.

Likewise the great masses of the white people do not fear the masses of the colored people as they fear of the extremist white agitators.

"I say to the great masses of both races, let us approach our problems in the spirit of calmness, understanding, debate and deliberation."

"Especially do I call on each of us individually and collectively to approach our problems without fear of one race or the other race."

### 8 Feared Dead Ohio State Plans Gigantic Telescope

COLUMBUS, Ohio, Feb. 21 (AP)—Ohio State University announced today that construction will start in late spring on the largest radio telescope in the world.

The first half of the project will be financed by a \$48,000 grant by the National Science Foundation, Washington, D.C.

The telescope—It will be 700 feet long and 75 feet high when finished—will be located near the Perkins Observatory near Delaware, Ohio. The observatory is operated jointly by Ohio State and Ohio Wesleyan University.

Its designer, Dr. John D. Krause of Ohio State's electrical engineering faculty, expects the finished radio telescope to receive signals from as far off in outer space as the eye now can see with regulation-type telescopes.
