Fired On By Brother, Youth Gains Freedom

VIENNA, Austria —The only survivor among four young Hungarian refugees who made a dash for freedom through the Iron Curtain on a farm tractor told reporters today he recognized his own brother among the Hungarian border guards who fired on them.

He said the other three youths were killed by machine-gun fire as they sought to tear through the barbed wire entanglements that guard Communist Hungary's frontier with free Austria. Only Friedrich, 18, made it to safety. He told Austrian border police that his family is Communist. He said his brother, Christoph, is a lieutenant in the border police and his father is the captain and commander of the border post.

Turncoat John Loses Another Freedom Fight

KARLSRUHE, Germany — Otto John, the double turncoat, lost another round today in his fight to free himself of treason charges.

The West German Supreme Court refused to accept an arrest order against the 47-year-old former head of the Gestapo. The effect of the ruling was that John was sent back to prison with little likelihood that he will escape trial on suspicion of treason charges, probably in the summer.

Senate To Hear Seaman's Story

WASHINGTON — Soviet seamen who spurred repatriation in a dramatic face-to-face encounter with the Soviet ambassador prepared to tell their story to Senate investigators today.

The Subcommittee, which is looking into Soviet activities in the United States, already has heard from the fourth seaman, 29-year-old Viktor Solovayev.

Four met at an immigration hearing yesterday with Ambassador Georgi Zarubin. He pleaded in vain with them to return to Russia. Their stated "pretext" left no doubt about their present determination to "stay here forever," as they put it in talking later with newsmen.
