THE decision to call up reinforcements for Charlotte's war on juvenile crime is wise. But in voting to enlarge the Mayor's Committee on Juvenile Delinquency speterday, the City Council singled out only a few representatives of government for membership. Unfortunately, the problem has existed too long for such orthodox medicine. It has permeated the entire social fabric of the community. It will take more than the normal loads of government to provide an antidote. To our mind, the situation calls for the best minds and experience in and out of government. They should be marshalled and concentrated you the problem in all of its many facets. The advisory committee should be made up of representatives of the police, the courts, the schools, the public welfare department, the mental health agencies, the employment security commission, the churches, correctional institutions, youth organizations, child and family service agencies, civic clubs, public information media and other organizations and individuals, public and private, who are concerned with the overall problem in any of its many aspects.

Size need not be a handicap. Individual situations can be handled by committees of particularly qualified people.
An executive committee could be its
brain center.
Certainly the group needs dynamic,
leaders. It must not be allowed to go to
sleep on the job. It should have regular meetings and issue regular reports
of its findings and recommendations.
Above all, it must be remembered
that the problem will, not cure itself or

government fiat, it will take hard thinking by a lot of dedicated people working together.
