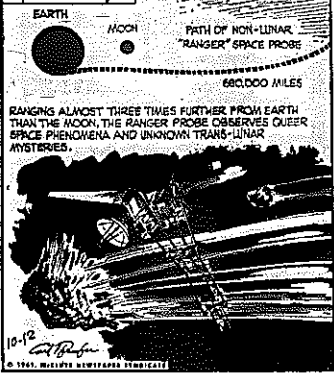
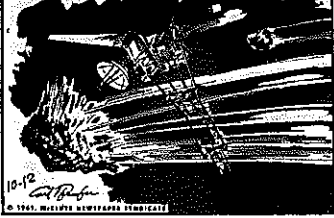

## 'We Must Live With Cold War'

Continued From Front Page as an example for the nation today.

"All America can profit from what happened in this state a century ago. It was this state, firmly fixed in traditions of the South, which sought a way of reason . . . yet when the war came, North Carolina provided one-fourth of all the Confederate soldiers who made the supreme sacrifice," he continued.

KENNEDY said it must be the aim of the nation "to keep an eye both on our dangers and our opportunities and not to be diverted by momentary gains, setbacks, or pressures."

Kennedy said the task of Americans as we see it is to "serve our nation's interest as we see it" and not to be swayed by the threat of those who would make themselves masters of the world.

Kennedy's speech, delivered from notes, abounded with references to great men in history and quotations from their works to prove that wisdom and intellectual honesty have fortified the most lasting of governments.

At the conclusion of the speech, Gov. Sanford preceded President Kennedy to the fore of the platform to receive his honorary degree from his alma mater.

President Kennedy, who got a laugh when he mentioned his own schooling "at a small land grant institution in Massachusetts, Harvard College," then arose to receive the honorary degree.

The citation paid tribute to his accomplishments as an admiral, as a Navy lieutenant in the second World War, and in the political arena.

Within minutes after the people, pale blue and white coats

was draped over the President's shoulders, his party was moving out of Kenan Stadium for the return trip to Raleigh-Durham Airport and the short hop to Ft. Bragg.

KENNEDY was to review the troops and make a short speech upon his arrival at Ft. Bragg. Then he was to spend the afternoon watching the famed 82nd Airborne Division in a display of weapons and combat readiness. The paratroops were trained in air drops and guerrilla demonstrations as well as fire advanced weapons.

The President donned his cap and gown as he arrived at the stadium entrance.

He and University President William C. Friday made up the third duo in the academic procession into the stadium where Clemson beat North Carolina in football last Saturday before a smaller crowd.

For the first time outside Washington, Kennedy rode in the elegant new White House bubbletop limousine from Raleigh-Durham Airport to Chapel Hill. The plastic cover was removed two miles outside Chapel Hill as the President and Gov. Sanford were in clear view of the crowd.

Kennedy was accompanied by four high officials closely associated with the Berlin crisis.

They were Llewellyn Thompson, ambassador to Russia; Walter Dowling, ambassador to West Germany; Charles E. Bohlen, former ambassador to Russia; and now a special assistant to Secretary of State Dean Rusk, and McGeorge Bundy, Kennedy's deputy for national security affairs.

Secretary of Commerce and Mrs. Luther H. Hodges headed in the North Carolina group who landed with Kennedy. Hodges is a former governor of North Carolina.

## Court Dodges Stand On Single Shot Votes

RALEIGH (AP) — The State Supreme Court has declined to take a stand on the constitutionality of single shot voting ordinances.

The court, however, did rule against a Negro who ran unsuccessfully for a seat on the Wilson City Board of Commissioners and who challenged a charter provision prohibiting single shot voting.

The court ruled that T. A. Watkins would not have won a seat even if all controlled ballots were counted and hence was not deprived of any constitutional rights.

The Wilson City Charter, enacted by the 1957 Legislature, provided, "No ballot for commissioner."

## City Moves To Halt Suit

A motion to dismiss a \$200,000 suit against the City of Charlotte will be heard Wednesday by Judge Wilson W. Work of Federal Western Carolina District Court.

The suit was filed by John C. Bennett, a local accountant, in July. City Attorney John T. Morrissey Sr. and former City Attorney John D. Shaw will appear to escort the day at the 10 a.m. hearing.

Bennett claims city officials, including former city attorney Shaw, conspired against him in legal proceedings.

The suit was filed in federal court here under the due process and equal protection provisions of the 14th Amendment to the Constitution.

## Rusk Pledges Peace Effort

MIAMI BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Secretary of State Dean Rusk says the United States "will work diligently to move the world along the road toward disarmament."

Rusk told the United Church Women's Convention last night that the United States once had a monopoly on atomic weapons, "but we were willing to put these weapons aside and share in the better use of our knowledge of the peacetime uses of atomic energy."

He said there would have been no nuclear arms race "but for Soviet obstructionism."

"Whether our latest efforts bear results depends primarily on whether our Soviets change their attitude," he added.

Rusk said this nation will stand firm in direct dealings with the Soviets, in building an Atlantic alliance and in working with the United Nations.

He said the paramount objective of our new program of helping underdeveloped nations is to foster long-range social and economic development.
