### Red-Haired Woman Sought By Police In Mattson Kidnap Case

Ex-Convict Questioned, And Held In Jail By Washington Officers—Reported Dead Lad's Kin Will Face Suspect—Parents Deny It.

Seattle, Feb. 10.—(AP)—State Patrol Chief William Cole set out today in quest of a "red-haired woman" for questioning as the reported companion of a man held as a suspect in the kidnap-killing of 13-year-old William Mattson, Tacoma physician's son.

Cole said he expected to pick up the woman at Stillington, near Tacoma, and that questioning her might shed further light on the prisoner's activities.

Families of the three children who witnessed 10-year-old Charles Mattson's abduction from his Tacoma home December 27, denied, a Seattle police officer stated, that the youngsters would seek to identify the suspect in a police lineup.

Charles' mother, Mrs. W. W. Mattson, in Tacoma, said "there is nothing to the report" that her son, William, Mattson, 11, and daughter, Maud, would come here to confront the man.

### REVENUE BILL IN HOUSE

Act Would Raise Record Sum Of \$75,000,000

### DEBATE BEGINS

Balch, Feb. 10.—(AP)—The house received the biennial revenue bill from the joint finance committee today.

The measure was reported in record time, more than a month earlier than last year, and proposes raising a record total of more than \$75,000,000 in general fund revenues for the biennium 1937-39. Highway revenues are not covered by the general tax bill.

Immediate consideration by the house as a committee-of-the-whole was voted.

### Parks Board Asking Revenue For Work

Representatives Of Commission Will Present Figures Showing Need For More Money—Asking For High Tax Levy Here.

The need for increased revenue to provide an adequate recreation program and the necessity for a levy boosted to five cents on the \$100 of values here to the city council by representatives of the park and recreation commission this afternoon.

Charles W. Bundy, chairman of the commission, has requested an opportunity to present to the members of the council the need for more funds to provide Charlotte with a program of recreation commensurate with the city's place among cities.

It has been proposed to increase the two-cent park and recreation levy to five cents and the park board is to ask the council to approve the measure which will be presented in the state legislature authorizing an election on the tax increase.

### Agree To Pay On Asbestosis Claims Here

Claimants And Attorneys Are Told That Insurance Companies Will Pay \$31,900.

Two of the three members of the State Industrial Commission today told asbestosis claimants and attorneys that the companies involved in the cases against Carolina Asbestos Company, a South Carolina corporation, had agreed to pay the \$31,900 claimants a total of \$31,900. The commission was set in motion before the recorder's courtroom at the county courthouse.

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# County To Aid Needy; Expect \$17,000 Grant

## Anti-Slum Campaign Of The News Given High Commendation

**Representative Citizens Declare Improvement Should

Representative citizens of Charlotte, commenting on the news campaign for improvement of housing conditions in slum sections here, were unanimous in declaring that conditions should be improved.

"We declared slum districts are a constant menace to the betterment of the city," said the citizens, "and that the elimination of slums is a health and humanitarian measure and that something should be done."

John Fletcher, manager, printing department of Pound and Moore: "You can have expected the average person to be the higher than the slum environment in which they are placed. Children, white or black, should be allowed a fair chance. Certainly they aren't getting it in the horrible picture in the News."

AMAZED

# Pay Raise Schedule Proposed

Raleigh, Feb. 10.—Heads of North Carolina's departments will not have unhampered discretion to apply salary raises how and as they please if final legislative approval is given a measure introduced in the house yesterday by Representative Virgil Wilson, of Forsyth.

The act lays down hard and fast rules, within certain salary brackets, of the minimum salary increase which shall be applied.

The scale is: employees earning \$44 or less per month, to receive at least a 30 per cent increase; those getting from \$45 to \$67, not less than 20 per cent; those from \$68 to \$100, not less than 15 per cent; and those making more than \$100 not less than five per cent.

The act would apply to all state departments, institutions, except schools, and its provision termination action aim by representatives.
