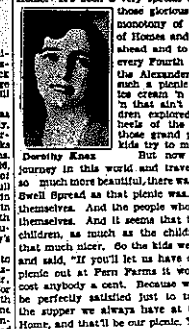
PICKETT'S CHARGE: Officer in center with an saber is Brigadier General Armistead, mortally wounded in this desperate climax of Gettysburg.

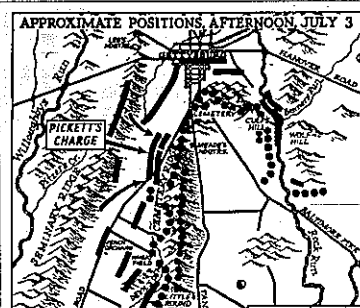

Pickett came riding out as he was on parade, city men cried, "For to your post! Don't forget today that you are from old Virginia!" Almost at the same instant, General Johnson Pettigrew said to his nearest officer, "Now, General Lee, for the honor of the old North State, forward!"

At 1 P. M. 2000 men were led by Miller's battery, followed by the 15th and 17th regiments, and then by Pickett's division. The charge was a desperate one, and the result was a tactical disaster for the Confederates.

BULLETIN

HEADQUARTERS ARMY OF THE POTOMAC, CEMETERY RIDGE, GETTYSBURG, PA., July 3, 1863.—We defeated the rebels this afternoon in our major engagement. The rebels' infantry charged, apparently 20,000 strong, over a rifle-works front.

At one point the invaders crossed our breastworks but were beaten back in furious fighting. With General Hancock wounded and commands badly mixed, General Meade has abandoned the idea of a counter-attack. The enemy is still on Seminary Ridge.

General Lee was magnificent. As soon as he saw the men returning from the charge, he rode out to rally them with quiet words. When he and General Pickett and his staff were taken to the rear, he had no division left him, he said. "Come, General Pickett, this has been my fight and upon my shoulders rests the blame. The men and officers of your division have written the name of Virginia as high today as ever it has been written before." To General Lee, the charge was a tactical disaster.

Sheriff Mack Rife draws \$300 a month in salary. The amount is set by law and cannot be changed, except by action of the Legislature. In addition he gets \$30-a-month car allowance. The County Commissioners reimburse that.

Sheriff's number of deputies and their salaries. Neither the sheriff nor his deputies receive any fees (although sheriff's fees are attached to many bills of costs. The fees are dumped into the County's general fund.)

BULLETIN

HEADQUARTERS ARMY OF THE POTOMAC, CEMETERY RIDGE, GETTYSBURG, PA., July 4, 1863.—The Army of Northern Virginia has been victorious in our major engagement. The rebels' infantry charged, apparently 20,000 strong, over a rifle-works front.

Continued rain makes reconnaissance difficult. We do not know the enemy's position accurately. At daylight we had gone from in front of our right but still faced reports of cavalry actions on our flanks—Stuart made his headquarters at the Potomac, but if General Meade wants a fight, he can get it.
