

Give Navy Expansion Bill Okay

House Sends Measure To Senate

WASHINGTON—The House unanimously passed and sent to the Senate today legislation to authorize construction of an additional 150,000 tons of naval shipping.

The expansion measure was approved after a brief explanation by Chairman Vinson, Democrat, Georgia, of the House Naval Committee, who said that the additional tonnage did not include any battleships.

In reply, Vinson said that the more the United States built the more she would be able to cope with any military emergency. He said that the bill would provide for the construction of 120,000 tons of naval ships, including 10,000 tons of aircraft carriers, destroyers, and submarines, but he made no reference to the possible number.
