Is Stalin Starving Russia To Supply Nazi Germany?

Maybe Germany is getting considerable quantities of supplies out of Russia, after all.

Spencer Williams, Secretary of the American-Russian Chamber of Commerce, says that leading Russian hotels are awarming with Germans there to organize the supply service for the Nazis.

And that the standard of living in the Soviet paradise has dropped to the level of its former level in the last four months because of a 35-per cent rise in the price of food. This rise was officially ordered in mid-January, says Mr. Williams...

It sounds an appallingly brutal thing to turn to starving the people of Russia to save the skins of British armies, and get German guns, machines, etc. in return. But that is no reason for doubting it. It is already well established that Stalin once before starved a host of his own people...
