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Trade With Hitler?

WASHINGTON—The record shows it abundantly clear that Hitler is not to be trusted. It would be speculations to believe that at this point except that in spite of the results, there was still hope that this country was going to do business with Hitler and who, at mass meetings, their statements that he is going to do business with Hitler.

THE FAMOUS TREATY FORBIDS INVASION

Yet on Aug. 23, 1923, was announced the German-Russian non-aggression pact. Arranged by the most valuable contracting parties "oblige themselves to refrain from every act of force, every aggressive action and every RUSK against one another."

The war with Russia does not sound like an effort to adjust differences "exclusively" by friendly exchange of opinion. This past freed Hitler to begin war. It has been too long since the most valuable agreement since Munich. Yet now, less than two years later he has violated it and pounded on Russia.

Could any negotiated peace, any settlement between us and Hitler, give us the faintest sense of security? No matter what happens, could we be certain of a potential enemy, ready to strike whenever it seemed desirable and possible? Any peace with Hitler on top would be for us an armed truce, an indefinite era of suspicion and ceaseless apprehension, and constant preparation against possible attack.

YOU MUST CURB THE PRESS TO PLEASE HITLER
The second event to be noted is the German-Russian amity pact. It carries a protocol under which Turkey agrees to curb anti-Hitler newspapers and radio talk. Berlin desperately says the press trade was especially welcome in Berlin because Turkish newspapers have been a source of constant hostility to German officials.
