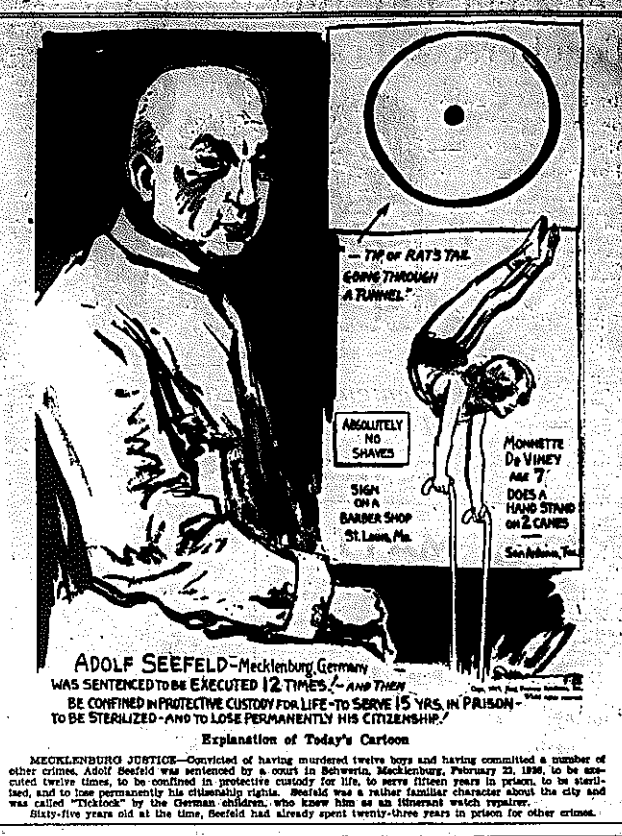

MECKLENBURG JUSTICE—Convicted of having murdered twelve boys and having committed a number of other crimes, Adolf Seefeld was sentenced by a court in Behring, Mecklenburg, February 23, 1938, to be executed twelve times, to be confined in protective custody for life, to serve fifteen years in prison, to be sterilized, and to lose permanently his citizenship rights. Seefeld was a rather familiar character about the city and was well liked by the German children who knew him as "Herr Seefeld."

News of 75 and 100 Years From Files in the State Library at Raleigh

LATEST NORTHERN NEWS Richmond:—The Northern papers have full particulars of the great battle fought near Sharpsburg by the two armies last Wednesday and Thursday. The Federal forces were commanded by McClellan in person and numbered the whole command of General Burnside, recently augmented by the addition of several new regiments of the army corps lately under General McDowell now under Gen. Hooker; Gen. Sumner's corps; Gen. Franklin's corps; Gen. Banks' corps, commanded by Gen. Williams; and Byker's division of Pritz John. Porter's corps.

The line of battle was between four and five miles long, with their left stretching across the Sharpsburg road. Burnside was on the extreme left. Porter held a commanding eminence to the right of Burnside, though Warren's brigade of Porter's corps was subsequently posted in the woods the left in support of Burnside's men; Sumner's corps was on an eminence next to the right; North, from Porter, and Hooker had the extreme right. The Northern papers say that our line was very near parallel with that of the Federal front and that our left was directly in front of Hooker.
