

HAND LAKERS FOURTH LOSS

The Los Angeles Lakers literally came within an inch of dethroning Boston as the National Basketball Association champions last season. This year, the experts said they'd go all the way. Instead they seem to be determined to go all the way to the bottom.

The Chicago Zephyrs, getting a fine defensive performance from Woody Saunders, handed the Lakers their fourth straight loss, 118-107 Wednesday night. St. Louis beat Cincinnati 121-114 in the only other league action.

The Lakers lost the seventh game of the NBA final playoff to Boston by one point last season, with a shot by Los Angeles' Frank Selvy rimming the basket and falling out at the buzzer. They were the choice to halt Boston's drive for a fifth straight title this season.

But with five games gone the Lakers have only an opening night victory to show for their efforts. They're in fourth place in the Western Division, ahead of only winless Detroit, and 1½ games back of Chicago.

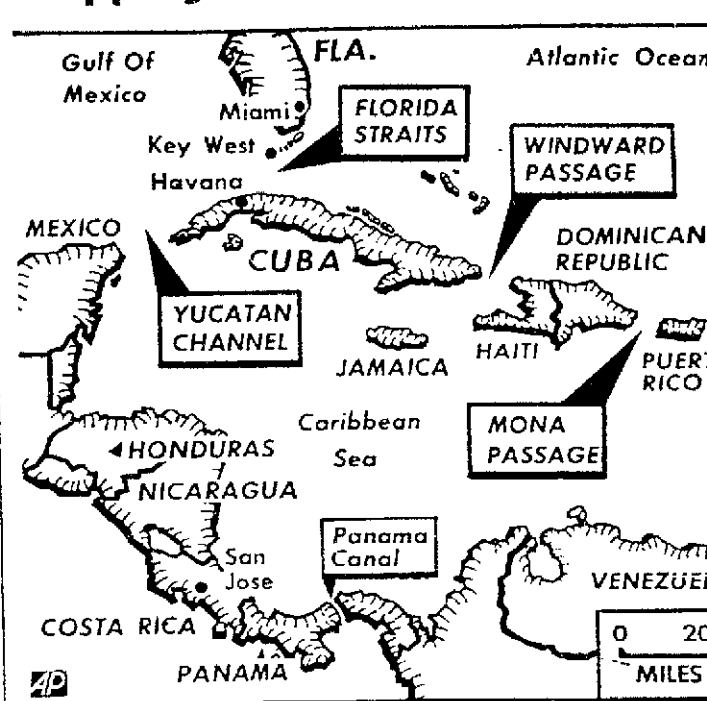

CHESTER, Pa. (AP)—Rep. James E. Van Zandt, R-Pa., says he was told secretly in mid-August rocket launching pads were being built in Cuba. He says he didn't debate President Kennedy when Kennedy said the weapons were defensive because the information was classified secret.

Van Zandt, Republican candidate for the U.S. Senate from Pennsylvania, told the Republican Women of Radnor Township Wednesday that he also was told secretly that short-range and intermediate-range missiles, MIG 20s and 21s, PT boats "and all kinds of contraband of war were being imported" from Russia.

The briefing came, said Van Zandt, in his capacity as a member of the House Armed Services Committee.

"The President said (in September) these weapons were defensive weapons," said Van Zandt. "I didn't debate him then. That information (at the briefing) was classified secret at the time. The President told about it (on Monday) so now I can use it."

SHARON Pa. (AP)—Republican gubernatorial candidate William Scranton said nothing but "a false face in front of the same old special interests, the same old moneybags and the same old tired, stone-face political philosophy," say Gov. Lawrence.

"The people are not easily fooled and they can see the Republican candidate for what he is," he added.

Speaking at a Mercer County Democratic dinner here Wednesday night, Lawrence accused Scranton of dashing "from one corner of this state to the other, saying yes to every pressure group and private interest that approaches him."

"Never before in the history of Pennsylvania politics has one man promised so many things to so many people in so little space of time," Lawrence said.

Earlier speaking at the dedication of a field house and special education center at Slippery Rock College, Lawrence hailed the Democrats' emphasis on education.

Old Musket Hides Revolutionary Map

BINGHAMTON, N. Y. (AP)—The 183-year old flintlock musket Robert T. Brennan of suburban Westover bought recently for \$100 was in fine condition on the outside but the barrel was plugged.

Brennan said he thought someone had left some wadding in the "Brown Bess." What he got out, but by his, was a wad of paper which Brennan believes was a letter written in the Revolutionary War period.

It was impossible to tell who wrote the letter or what it said, Brennan said. A few phrases and words were readable but did not add up to anything specific, he added.

"When I found out what it was, I was just sick," the gun collector said. "If I had only known it, I think I could have taken the letter out in one piece."

State Library manuscript experts believe the letter and paper are approximately of the Revolutionary period.

Brennan said he spotted the antique gun in an antique shop in Homer and traced it to Monsey, on the Hudson, near where a chain was stretched across the river to stop British ships.

On the back of the letter is a map which Brennan says may be a drawing of the chain across the Hudson.

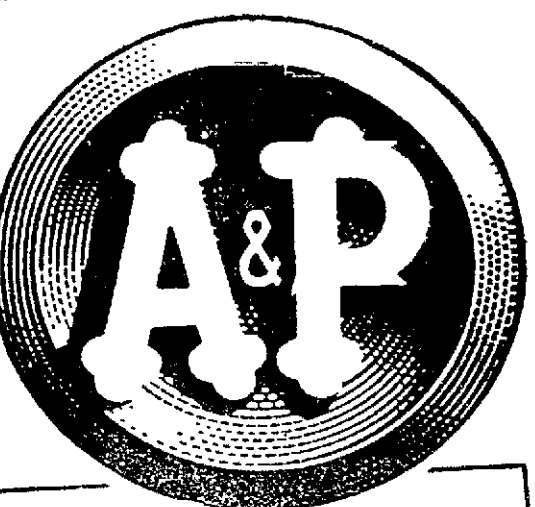
