CAPE CANAVERAL -- Per The Explorer 15 satellite roared into orbit Saturday night to study an artificial radiation belt formed by a U.S. highaltitude nuclear explosion last summer.

A Thor-Delta rocket propelled the payload into space at 6:15 p.m. and seven hours later the National Aeronauties and Space Administration reported a successful orbit was achieved.

The 98-pound package settled into a wide-looping course ranging from 190 to 10,950 miles above the earth. The path, only slightly higher than intended, will permit complete survey of the man-made

There was no immediate word on quality of data being received.

Earlier, a project official had reported apparent success of the launching.
