The Chinese established newspapers in Cuba, sent in news correspondents, drew up trade agreements and went to work behind the scenes to win Castro's ear. But China's star waned soon after the abortive Bay of Pigs invasion of 1961.

Though Castro seemed to prefer working with the Chinese, he recognized that Khrushchev could give him something Peiping did not havemissiles. The Soviet leader obligingly rattled them at the

United States. From that time on, the Russians were in the ascendancy Their victory was complete when Castro purged pro-Chinese elements in the Cuban Communist Party, a decision

Peiping meekly accepted.
Withdrawal of the Soviet missiles may give the Chinese a new chance to be heard.

Mao also is not likely to take with good grace Khrushchev's unilateral move to ease world tensions, or any step toward a thaw in the cold
