I have much pleasure in accepting your invitation. I hope to be able to leave early next week. I hope to bring a few aides with me and to leave some of them behind to continue our common effort towards the peaceful solution of the problem.

I also note and appreciate your feeling that the unserved respect for the sovereignty of Cuba is an essential pre-requisite to any solution of the problem.

I would very much hope that it might be possible for me to discuss with you all important aspects of the problem. It would be my hope that as a result of these discussions, a solution would be reached by which the principle of respect for the sovereignty of Cuba would be assured, and it may also be possible for action to be taken which would reassure other countries which have felt themselves threatened by recent developments in Cuba.

nese Nationalist government and recognition of Peiping.

The Chinese established newspapers in Cuba, sent in news correspondents, drew up trade agreements and went to work behind the scenes to win Castro's ear. But China's star waned soon after the abortive Bay of Pigs invasion of 1961.

Though Castro seemed to prefer working with the Chinese, he recognized that Khrushchev could give him something Peiping did not have—missiles. The Soviet leader obligingly rattled them at the United States.

From that time on, the Russians were in the ascendancy. Their victory was complete when Castro purged pro-Chinese elements in the Cuban Communist Party, a decision Peiping meekly accepted.

Withdrawal of the Soviet missiles may give the Chinese a new chance to be heard.

Mao also is not likely to take with good grace Khrushchev's unilateral move to ease world tensions, or any step toward a thaw in the cold war.

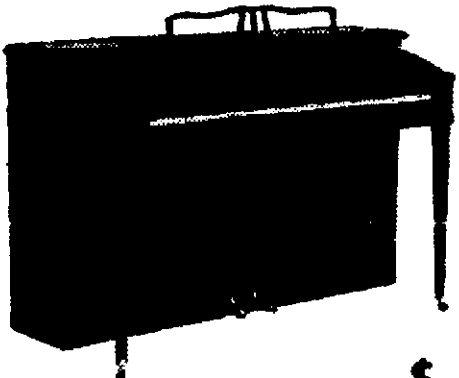
Khrushchev called President Eisenhower a man of good will following his 1959 visit to the United States. The Soviet leader used somewhat the same phrase in describing President Kennedy Sunday.

Peiping's view is that Kennedy is a "blood-stained murderer," a description often used by its propaganda services.
