### **Master Imagist Wins Grand Prize**

Thursday's announcement that John Steinbeck has received the Nobel Prize for Literature may have startled many who consider the American author of "The Grapes of Wrath" well past his prime.

The award was not given, however, for a particular work, although "The Winter of Our Discontent" was singled out as being an outstanding recent novel. The Swedish Academy of Letters hailed Steinbeck's writings in general as being "realistic and imaginative," and cited them for their "sympathetic humor and social perception."

Even Steinbeck's severest critics cannot deny the truth of the Academy's statements. The 60year - old author is a master of word imagery and descriptive prowess. To state it in a trite phrase that Steinbeck himself could express much better, he is capable of paingting pictures with words.

One persistent criticism of Steinbeck's work is that his paturalistic vein tends to make his animais resemble people and his people resemble animals. Steinbeck is certainly a lover of nature but he is much more. He draws his characters
