The Charlotte Air Base will be a scene of intense activity and the center of an important aerial mock warfare during a period of more than three months, beginning Aug. 15, according to an announcement by Brig. Gen. Walter H. Frank, commanding the pursuit-interceptor command of the Third Air Force, with headquarters at MacDill Field, Tampa, Fla.

The Charlotte Postoffice figures struck an all-time high for June, Acting Postmaster Neely Clegg's report stated this morning.

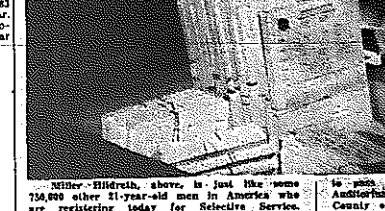
